Introduction

- Peninsular Malaysia - 13 states and 3 Federal Territories
- Borneo - 2 states of Sabah and Sarawak
- Country Administration - Westminster-style parliamentary system of democratic government with a constitutional monarchy.
- Middle-income country

Population and Ethnic Groups

- 28 million people
- 200 ethnic groups
- Peninsular Malaysia – Malay, Chinese, Indian, and Orang Asli
- Sabah and Sarawak- Kadazan, Dusun, Bajau, Iban, Dayak, Bidayuh, Murut, Penan, and others.

Population and Ethnic Groups

- Malays (51.3%), Chinese (30.6%), Indian (7.1%), and indigenous groups (11.1%).
- Malays and non-Malay indigenous groups - son-of-the-soil group or *Bumiputera*.
- Language – Malay, English, Mandarin, Tamil, Arabic, and Punjabi
- Religion - Islam, Christianity, Buddhism, Hinduism, and others

Categories of *Orang Asli* Village

Category	f	%	Criteria
Rural	327	38	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Can be reached with earth roads, road trails or waterways. - Do not have access to clean water, no electricity for 24 hours, and have no other basic amenities. - Economic resources are not fixed.
Outskirts of village	519	61	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Near the Malay villages. - Can be reached by road premix. - Basic facilities, potable water, and 24-hour electricity. - Having a land development project and the economic resources that remain.
City	6	1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Having the complete facilities. - There is no land development project.

Education for *Orang Asli*

- Malaysia has ethnic-based school system
- National School, National-Type Chinese School, and National-Type Tamil School.
- Orang Asli – National School
- Dropout rate – 50% for primary school, 30% for secondary school
- Common reasons of dropout - location, lack of awareness, family values

Issues in System of Education

- Ethnic-based polarization
- Access to education for *Orang Asli*
- Recognition one national language
- Establishment of a national school system
- Lack of inclusiveness in policy change
- Lack of clarity for higher education in social integration
- Lack of concerted efforts and directions from higher education communities

Social Integration Issues at HE

- Lack of clear agenda for integration
- Lack of consistency in policy implementation involving medium of instruction
- Lack of standardization regarding curriculum execution among institutions
- Lack of consistency on research reports regarding social integration

Study on Social Integration

- Measure the level of social integration among students of different ethnics
- Identify the students' perceptions and attitudes regarding inter-ethnic and inter-racial integration
- Instrument - Campus Social Environment Survey as an instrument.
- Social Behavior Index for higher education institution

- Government initiatives
- Initiative by universities

Government initiatives

- *Transformation of Higher Education*
- Develop an inclusive plan which put more focus on widening access and increasing equity, improving the quality of teaching and learning, strengthening research and innovation, cultivating life-long learning and strengthening the delivery system of higher education.
- *Research fund for social integration*

New Academic Courses

- Focus on learning and understanding different culture
- Expose to the concept of ethnic relations
- Inculcate the feeling of appreciation and understanding different culture and civilization
- Provide opportunities to carry out activities together

Policies for on Campus Activities

- No single-based ethnic club
- Incentive to organize multi-ethnics events
- Reduce-rate for sharing accommodation with different ethnics
- Request for facilities must involve multi-ethnics
- Support for college committee members appointment must involve multi-ethnics
- Appoint academic advisors with diverse background

Other Initiatives

- Allocation for academic advisors to conduct activities for indigenous students
- Extra tutoring and coaching for indigenous students
- Encourage academicians to provide group assignments
- Organize Service-Learning at indigenous areas
- Organize Entrepreneurial course for indigenous
